Are there any required fees for the exchange students: No. The Student Union Fee is voluntary. Student Union Fee: 142 euros / academic year, 76 euros / semester (bachelor / master level students). Fee for doctoral level students 48 euros / academic year, 24 euros / semester. More information about the Student Union available online at: vyy.fi/

Insurance: Exchange students are personally responsible for the insurances for themselves and their personal belongings. The insurance should be obtained before arrival to Finland, and it should cover costs resulting from illness or an accident (doctor and hospital charges, including medical treatment and hospitalization, medication, and costs resulting from interruption of exchange). Exchange students should also obtain an insurance for personal belongings and third party liability.

Permits (for exchange studies lasting min. 3 months):

Citizens of the EU, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland: No residence permit needed for Finland for exchange studies. Registration of an EU citizen's right of residence at a local service point of the Finnish Immigration Service (Migri) within 3 months. Other nationalities: Residence permit needed.
